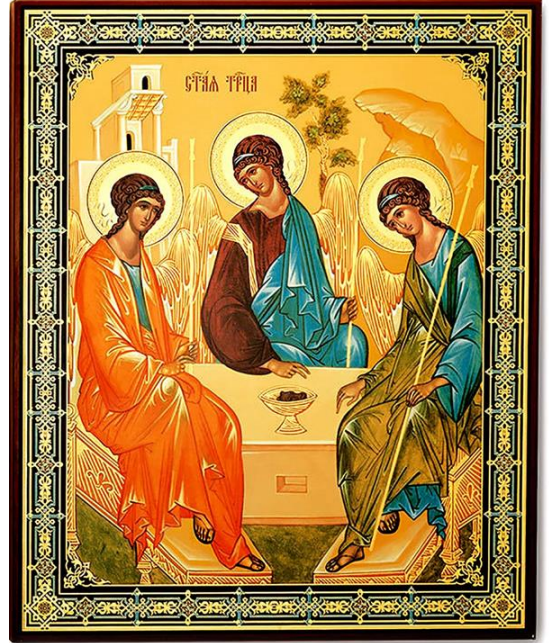


Holy Communion at St Paul's, Ashgrove

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the**

forgiveness of sins.

**We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.**
