Jeremiah 29: 1, 4-7

¹ These are the words of the letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent from Jerusalem to the remaining elders among the exiles, and to the priests, the prophets, and all the people, whom Nebuchadnezzar had taken into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon. ⁴ Thus says the Lord of hosts, the God of Israel, to all the exiles whom I have sent into exile from Jerusalem to Babylon: ⁵ Build houses and live in them; plant gardens and eat what they produce. ⁶ Take wives and have sons and daughters; take wives for your sons, and give your daughters in marriage, that they may bear sons and daughters; multiply there, and do not decrease. ⁷ But seek the welfare of the city where I have sent you into exile, and pray to the Lord on its behalf, for in its welfare you will find your welfare.

The Psalm is said responsively. The LA reads the words in the plain text. The congregation responds with the words in bold text.

Psalm 111

¹ O praise the Lord. I will praise the Lord with my whole heart:

in the company of the upright and among the congregation.

² The works of the Lord are great:

and studied by all who take delight in them.

³ His deeds are majestic and glorious:

and his righteousness stands for ever.

⁴ His marvellous acts have won him a name to be remembered:

the Lord is gracious and merciful.

⁵ He gives food to those that fear him:

he remembers his covenant for ever.

⁶ He showed his people the power of his acts:

in giving them the heritage of the heathen.

⁷ The works of his hands are faithful and just:

and all his commandments are sure;

⁸ They stand firm for ever and ever:

they are done in faithfulness and in truth.

⁹ He sent redemption to his people,

he ordained his covenant for ever:

holy is his name and worthy to be feared.

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and of good understanding are those that keep his commandments:

his praise shall endure for ever.

2 Timothy 2: 1-15

- ¹ You then, my child, be strong in the grace that is in Christ Jesus;
- ² and what you have heard from me through many witnesses entrust to faithful people who will be able to teach others as well.
- ³ Share in suffering like a good soldier of Christ Jesus.
- ⁴ No one serving in the army gets entangled in everyday affairs; the soldier's aim is to please the enlisting officer.
- ⁵ And in the case of an athlete, no one is crowned without competing according to the rules.
- ⁶ It is the farmer who does the work who ought to have the first share of the crops.
- ⁷ Think over what I say, for the Lord will give you understanding in all things.
- ⁸ Remember Jesus Christ, raised from the dead, a descendant of David—that is my gospel,
- ⁹ for which I suffer hardship, even to the point of being chained like a criminal. But the word of God is not chained.
- ¹⁰ Therefore I endure everything for the sake of the elect, so that they may also obtain the salvation that is in Christ Jesus, with eternal glory.
- ¹¹ The saying is sure:

If we have died with him, we will also live with him;

¹² if we endure, we will also reign with him;

if we deny him, he will also deny us:

¹³ if we are faithless, he remains faithful—

for he cannot deny himself.

- ¹⁴ Remind them of this, and warn them before God that they are to avoid wrangling over words, which does no good but only ruins those who are listening.
- ¹⁵ Do your best to present yourself to God as one approved by him, a worker who has no need to be ashamed, rightly explaining the word of truth.

¹¹ On the way to Jerusalem Jesus was going through the region between Samaria and Galilee. ¹² As he entered a village, ten lepers approached him. Keeping their distance, ¹³ they called out, saying, 'Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!' ¹⁴ When he saw them, he said to them, 'Go

and show yourselves to the priests.' And as they went, they were made clean. ¹⁵ Then one of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, praising God with a loud voice. ¹⁶ He prostrated himself at Jesus' feet and thanked him. And he was a Samaritan. ¹⁷ Then Jesus asked, 'Were not ten made clean? But the other nine, where are they? ¹⁸ Was none of them found to return and give praise to God except this foreigner?' ¹⁹ Then he said to him, 'Get up and go on your way; your faith has made you well.'


