Lighting of the Fourth Advent Candle—The Candle of Love

Light and peace, in Jesus Christ our Lord Thanks be to God

We have lit three candles - for hope, for peace, and for joy. Today we light the fourth candle—the candle of love. With this flame we signify the love of God that surrounds and fills us at all times, but that we recognize in a special way in the Christmas story. There is no greater power than love. It is stronger than rulers and empires, stronger than grief or despair, stronger even than death. We love, because God loves us.

Fourth candle is lit, symbol is hung on the tree

Light one candle of hope, One bright candle for hope. He brings hope to every heart. He comes! He comes!

Light one candle of peace, One bright candle for peace. He brings peace to every heart. He comes! He comes! Light one candle of joy, One bright candle for joy. Every nation will find salvation In Bethlehem's baby boy!

Light one candle of love, One bright candle for love. He brings love to every heart. He comes! He comes!

Loving God, in this time of preparation and planning, We thank you for the hope and peace you unfailingly offer us.

Show us the creative power of hope. Teach us the peace that comes from justice. Prepare our hearts to be transformed by you, That we may walk in the light of Christ.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name, through Christ our Lord.
