God of Holy Dreaming, Great Creator Spirit,


From the dawn of creation you have given your children the good things of Mother Earth. You spoke and the gum tree grew.

- ²⁶ Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth.
- ²⁷ But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong;
- ²⁸ God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to reduce to nothing things that are,
- ²⁹ so that no one might boast in the presence of God.
- ³⁰ He is the source of your life in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and

righteousness and sanctification and redemption,
³¹ in order that, as it is written, 'Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord.'
